1992-98

- The efforts of the Foundation entirely voluntary.
- Development of Research & Education Centre (R&E Centre) at level 6, Sligo General Hospital in collaboration with the North Western Health Board (NWHB). This development was managed by three Foundation Directors. The centre was part funded by donations raised by the Foundation and part funded by the NWHB.
- Personal Donation Scheme initiated to meet the loan cost of the R&E Centre.
- Research Grants awarded to three researchers at SGH in 1996

1998

- Official Opening of the Research & Education Centre by Health Minister Brendan Cowen.
- Administrative secretary seconded to the Foundation
- Co-ordination of a Core Skills Curriculum at SGH

1999

- Development of a programme of education activities including medical meetings and annual research conference.

2004 - 2017

- Continuation and consolidation of the Research Skills programme from 2004 onwards. Delivery of an annual programme of research training to staff eg biostatistics, research ethics, qualitative research, reference management, study designs, critical appraisal, questionnaire design.
- Continuation of the Annual Research Conference. 17th successive research conference held in November 2016. Conference features presentations of local research and external keynote speakers.

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- Research Seed Scheme offered every year from 2004 onwards. Grants awarded to research projects involving Sligo University Hospital. In total, more than €150,000 awarded in grants by the Foundation in the period 2004 – 2016.
- Participation in the HRB/MRCG Funding Scheme from 2006 including management of international peer review of submissions.
- Public Meetings introduced in 2004 to raise awareness of medical topics and for health promotion. Annual Men's Health Meetings during Men's International Health Week. Other public meetings held on Obesity, Osteoporosis, Forensic Science, Paediatric Cardiology, Child Safety, Adolescent Mental Health, Eating Disorders, Keeping your Brain Fit, Human Enhancement, Clinical Genetics, Food Allergy and many others.
- Medical Meetings for health professionals and approved for external CPD points with external speakers. Examples of topics: Infectious Diseases, Anxiety, Sudden Cardiac Death in the Young, Heart Failure, Stroke Management, Tobacco Control and many others
- Development of proposal for capital development of a Research & Education Centre – Clinical Services Support Centre (2004). Facilitation of a design brief for a capital development at the hospital site. Planning permission obtained
- Memorandum of understanding between IT Sligo and the Research & Education Foundation to carry out joint activities in research and education (2004)
- Site coordinator of the RCPI Masterclass series at SUH from 2014
- Provision of research support eg statistics, research ethics, poster design and printing
- Promotion of collaboration and strengthening of links with external institutions such as IT Sligo and NUIG. Hosting of discussion fora with IT Sligo research staff on ideas for collaboration. Support of collaborative research initiatives, participation in study project groups, workshops conducted at SUH by academic staff from other institutions etc.
- Continued provision of the secretariat for the Research Ethics Committee at SUH
- Initiation and management of research studies on topics such as Alcohol, Carers of Dementia Patients etc.
- Provision of research funds management for research groups within SUH including employment of research staff
