Who can present?

To be eligible to present, you will need to:

- Be an early stage health researcher^{*})
- Be able to attend the full event in-person
- Submit an abstract by Sunday September 24th 2023 Extended to Wednesday October 4th

Abstract Submission

To be selected as speaker, you will need to submit an abstract about a work-in-progress, i.e., current research that is not yet completed. This could include, for example, research you are currently conducting, or research that is completed but requires further interpretation prior to wider dissemination.

Selection Process

Abstract submissions will be externally reviewed and scored whereby from the accepted abstracts up to 15 early stage health researchers will be invited to present at the event. Abstracts are selected on the basis of their medical and scientific significance, timeliness, quality of data and methodology, potential impact and adherence to specific format requirements described below.

Accepted Abstracts

Abstracts will be accepted for presentation and poster OR poster only.

If your abstract is awarded an ORAL PRESENTATION at the early stage health researcher forum, you will be asked to deliver a 5-minute presentation about your research project. After each block of presentations, there will be a 15-minute Q&A session for feedback, questions, and suggestions from an expert panel and other attendees.

If your abstract is awarded a POSTER PRESENTATION, poster boards will be at the meeting and are A0 format. Printed posters, preferable portrait must be dropped of by Friday, 3rd November 2023 in SUH Library, Level 6. Posters will be on display at the Poster Exhibition from November 3rd to 17th on Level 6, in front of the library in the SUH. The Research & Education Foundation Medal is awarded to the best poster presented in Category I by a doctor or medical student and in Category II by a nursing, midwifery, health and social care professional or undergraduate student.

^{*)} 'Early stage health researchers' (ESHRs) are defined as individuals working in the area of health/ academia who are less than 5 years health research active (full-time equivalent research experience). Our definition of ECHRs includes postgraduate students, doctoral students, post-doctoral researchers, medical doctors, nurses and health & social care professionals and equivalent.
